Bullying is not acceptable at any time. If it happens to you, tell someone.

Now!

Our school is a happy place when;

- everyone is kind to each other
- everyone is willing to help each other
- everyone is looking after each other
- everyone is smiling at each other
- everyone is one big close family and we can stop having any arguments
- everyone walks away and ignores the bully
- everyone invites others to play if they are alone
- everyone can discuss any problems with any member of staff

If you are caught bullying another child this is what happens;

- The first time you will get a warning.
- The second time you are asked to go and see the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher.
- The third time the school will contact your parents.
- If it continues, we will ask your parents to come to the school to discuss the matter fully.
- You will have to apologise fully and publicly to the person you have bullied.
- If the bullying continues, the school will refer the matter to the County Council.

What you can do if you are bullied;

- Walk away
- Tell your class teacher immediately
- If you can't do this, tell a member of the class or a close friend
- Tell your parents
- Think
- Why did he or she bully me?
- Did I do anything wrong?
- If the person is still bullying you, tell the Head teacher or Deputy Head teacher, or any members of staff.

What is bullying?

- Name calling, somebody who says nasty things.
- Somebody who is a constant nuisance.
- Kicking, pulling your hair, being nasty and hurting you.
- Somebody making your life a pain.
- Somebody who calls you names or is being cruel.
- Bullying is nasty and horrible.
- Bullies can laugh at your efforts or talk behind your back.

What you as parents can do to stop bullying;

- If you know or hear of a bullying incident then please contact the school immediately.
- Encourage the children not to be aggressive. Try to train them to turn the other ear. This doesn't make them 'soft'.
- Please support the school if there is any further action.
- Discuss your child's problems with him rather than hiding them.
- Out of school hours
- We know that the behaviour of our children outside school hours is not the responsibility of the school, but we feel that children's behaviour is a reflection of our school.
- We will treat any case of bullying that occurs in the community
- Do you control how much TV your child watches?
- Do you control how much time your child spends on the computer?
